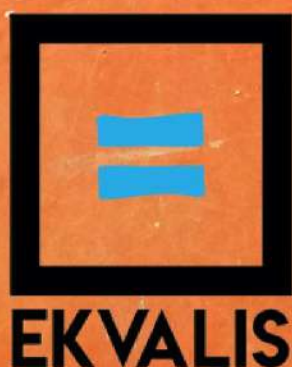

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REPORT PREFACE:

Association for Educational Development- Ekvális has been active in implementing diverse projects and initiatives in 2022. In 2022, Ekvális felt the consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic and economic crisis which have influenced our organization and posed several challenges related to the mental health and well being of our activists, volunteers and staff and the shrinking space and financial uncertainty for the civil society caused by the lack of funding.

Despite these challenges, Ekvális was active in important areas of work related to its mission and engaged meaningfully with the target groups of the organization. In this Annual Report, you will find an overview of the following project, programs and initiatives implemented in 2022:

- Educational activities, trainings, conferences and events
- Activism and community engagement
- Advocacy and campaigning
- Networking, Partnerships and Mobility

At the end of this report, Ekvális has made a provisional engagement in numbers. The report contains numbers that reflect the participation of target groups in different programs and projects. It also includes programs and projects led by Ekvális, but also from partners in partnership project and initiatives where Ekvális had partnership role.

This report includes a narrative overview of the highlighting programs and projects during the year, as well as inflow and outflow financial report of the organization.

Ekvális expresses gratitude to all donors, supporters, experts, institutions, commercial partners,

media and most of all volunteers and activists who have made 2022 a successful year.

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES, TRAININGS, CONFERENCES AND EVENTS

1. TRAINING FOR ACTIVISTS “YOUTH INPUTS IN SUSTAINING GENDER AND LGBTIQ+ MOVEMENTS“

In June 2022, Ekvális organized a 7 day training on the topic “Youth Inputs in Sustaining Gender and LGBTIQ+ Movements “. This training was part of the project “Perspectives of Gender and LGBTIQ+ Youth Movements“ supported by the European Youth Foundation and the Council of Europe.

The training gathered 20 youth activists from all over the country. Through an intensive 6-day training program, participants expanded their knowledge, skills and capacities on using innovative and creative ways for feminist and queer activism. As part of the training program, participants reflected on the ways the anti-gender movement operates, using real life examples from North Macedonia and abroad. Most importantly, throughout versatile tools and methods, participants learned about ways to respond to the anti-gender movement and protect and enhance democracy in a country that’s still not fully democratized.



The training opened up space for societal and personal reflection through various case studies, scenarios, and role-play exercises. The trainers also shared new knowledge and presentations on the strategies of operating of anti-gender movements and tools for creative and non-violent responses. The program has also enabled participants to practice their media research skills and creating a landscape of the operations of anti-gender movements which then helped to create responsive media tactics for the follow-up campaign.



The program of the training was fully implemented using methods of non-formal and learner-centered education. This provided a space for participants to contribute towards the group learning and give their own input, sharing experiences and offering their personal skills and knowledge in the topic.

During the training the participants got familiar with the history and today's context of the gender and LGBTIQ+ movements locally, they discussed and elaborated on the potentials and challenges of the movements, analyzed the ways that the anti-gender movements in North Macedonia operate. The trainers also gave specific tools on how the participants can actively participate as leaders in the gender and queer movements and advocate for more visible inclusion of young people in these movements. With the tools learned as part of the training, the participants also created strategies on how they can respond to the anti-gender sexist, homophobic and transphobic narratives in a creative and non-violent way.

Participants have learned about the state in which the Gender and LGBTIQI+ movement in North Macedonia operate. They got deep insight into how this movement contributes in the democratization processes of the country and how the democracy isn't fully accomplished as long as gender and sexual minorities aren't being sufficiently represented in the decision-making processes. Besides, participants were aware of the broader image of the queer and feminist movement in North Macedonia and what strategies and actions have been used in the struggle so far, as well as what are the possible strategies that can be used in future.

2. PEACE EDUCATION IN THE CLASSROOM

In the first part of 2022, Ekvalis together with the offices of forumZFD in Skopje implemented series of activities promoting the handbook “In class for peace” and discussions current state with ethnocentrism in education in the Western Balkan countries.

Firstly with the offices of forumZFD’s in Skopje and Prishtina it was implemented promotional, informative and educational workshops on the possible use of the Manual “In class for peace” as an alternative educational resource in peace education with educators active in the formal, non-formal education, adult education and life- long learning from Macedonia and Kosovo.

The second part of the partnership with forumZFD’s offices in Skopje, Pristina and Sarajevo, prepared a set of 7 online talks with different educational stakeholders from the region, focused on the ethnocentrism and segregation in the field of education and their recommendation for overcoming ethnocentric educational practices.

The third part of our collaboration with forumZFD’s offices in Skopje, Prishtina, Belgrade and Sarajevo and Peace Education Hub (PEH) of the Faculty of Philosophy in Sarajevo were implemented online discussion with representatives of educational institutions, teachers, non-formal and adult educators, youth workers and other peace education stakeholders from Western Balkans, to reflect on current situation with ethnocentric and divisive practices in education in Western Balkans, and discussions the ways of challenging dominant mono-ethnic narratives and improving the role of peace education in preventing violent conflicts and wars in the region.

2. FORUM THEATER TRAINING

Ekvalis together with forumZFD office in Skopje and Media Artes, implemented a training on the application of forum theater as a tool for creating a safe space for discussing thoughts, fears, attitudes, experiences and similar, related to dealing with ethnocentric narratives, stereotypes, prejudices and discrimination as well as facing and dealing with past traumatic experiences and initiating personal and social transformations for educators, active in formal and informal education as well as youth workers, social workers and peace activists. The follow up action of this training was implementation of the forum theater as a tool in 4 different areas of North Macedonia (Skopje, Shtip, Veles and Kichevo).

3.INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE IN PARTNERSHIP WITH PEOPLE TO PEOPLE INTERNATIONAL- EUROPE

In June 2022, the 2022 PTPI European Conference took place in North Macedonia with more than 40 guests from Switzerland, Sweden, Denmark, Germany, UK, USA, Romania, Bulgaria, Kosovo, Armenia and Serbia. Ekvális was partner in organizing this conference in two ways: content part of the conference (related to activities for inclusive education) and Ekvális volunteers helped with the preparation and implementation of the conference.



Ekvalis co-facilitated the implementation of the Living Library as part of this conference where the attendees had the possibility to have conversations with 5 local people that had the role as books: Romani woman, mother of a child with autism (and Zumba instructor for children with disabilities), lesbian activists, urban eco activist and father of a child with cerebral palsy. The Living Library was organized as part of Ekvális work with inclusive methods and involved partners and local activists that Ekvális closely cooperates with throughout the years.



In addition, Ekvális hosted a fundraising event as part of this conference consisting of two parts. In the first part of this event, Ekvális hosted a panel discussion where the guests were familiarized with the work of our organization. As speakers on the panel discussion participated Angel Dimitrievski and Elena Danova as part of the Ekvális Executive Office and Hristina Jovcevska and Ilarija Dimulkova as part of the volunteer group.

In the second part of this event, Ekvális organized a bazaar and networking event where the guests could donate and support the projects and programs of our organization.

The conference was an excellent opportunity for Ekvális to familiarize people from all over the world with our work and get meaningful support and acknowledgment for the local work that Ekvális is doing.

4.ROUNDTABLE “PERSPECTIVES OF GENDER AND LGBTIQ+ MOVEMENTS IN NORTH MACEDONIA“

Ekvalis organized a roundtable as part of the project “Perspectives of Gender and LGBTIQ+ Youth Movements“ supported by the European Youth Foundation and the Council of Europe.

The focus of the roundtable was the future of feminist and queer movement in North Macedonia. This event was held in Skopje and broadcasted online too which allowed a broader audience to participate in it. The Discussion included people from NGOs that work on the focal issues of this project as well as representatives of institutions and individual activists who fight for the cause.



The roundtable discussion was attended by Gorgi Tasev (representatives by the Government of North Macedonia) to whom the participants shared their concerns, visions and inputs on how the government can be more proactive in protecting gender and LGBTIQ+ minorities. In the second part of the event, Elena Gagovska, an expert and researcher on anti-gender movements and youth feminist hosted a conversation around transgender people, anti-gender movements and moral panics. In the final session, Elena Petrovska from Coalition Margins shared the historical vision of the LGBTIQ+ movement and requested input from the youth for their participation in the movement. The participants and the guests then attended a networking lunch where they could further discuss and strategize on the importance of these topics.



5. PUBLIC EVENT FOR THE “DEMOCRACY HERE-DEMOCRACY NOW” CAMPAIGN IN STRUMICA

Ekvalis took part in several activities as part of the “Democracy Here–Democracy Now” campaign initiated by the Council of Europe. One of the activities on local level was a street pop-up action in Strumica where young people asked the citizens of Strumica what are their vision for pluralistic, open and inclusive democracy. This action was initiated by the participants from the project “Perspectives of Gender and LGBTIQ+ Youth Movements” supported by the European Youth Foundation and the Council of Europe. During the training as part of the same project, the participants were familiarized with the scope of the “Democracy Here–Democracy Now” campaign and were invited to brainstorm follow-up actions on how they can bring closer this campaign in North Macedonia.

This action helped the participants to understand the true and diverse dimension on what the citizens want in terms of democracy improvements and that regards to transparency of the institutions, fairness of the system for every citizen, elimination of inability of certain minority groups to access fundamental human rights and the ability of the institutions to protect those citizens.



ACTIVISM AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

1. WOMEN'S RIGHT PROTEST FOR 8-TH OF MARCH, INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY "POVERTY HAS A FEMALE FACE"

As a member of the Platform for Gender Equality, Ekvális participated in the annual Women's Day March for 8-th of March- International Women Day. In 2022, Ekvális staff, volunteers, activists and supporters rallied together with other fellow activists under the slogan "Poverty Has a Female Face".

Chanting "Poverty has a female face", the activists reminded that despite the fact that women constitute an equal half of the country's population, they still do not enjoy equal rights in almost any aspect of their lives, at work or at home, in politics and social life, and a state in which women are not included as equals is a state in which there is no progress.



On this protest we addressed the following actions:

- Adopting effective policies and measures to deal with the consequences of Covid-19 that will include a gender perspective and take into consideration the needs of different categories of women, marginalized and vulnerable categories of women;
- Increased participation of women in the working groups that prepare and implement measures to respond to the situation with covid-19 and the economic crisis;
- Budget and economic policies for people, not for businesses and parties;
- Functional inspection services that prevent exploitation and discrimination of female workers!;
- Prevention of further privatization of social and health services!;
- Increased participation of women in decision-making positions through the introduction of quotas that provide for at least 40% participation of women in each level of government;
- Immediate adoption of the Gender Equality Strategy 2021-2026 and adoption of the Law on Gender Equality;

- Urgent adoption of a new Law on Labor Relations that provides for the protection of women workers who work with fixed-term contracts during pregnancy, birth and parenthood, the right of protection during pregnancy, birth and parenthood for women workers who perform unpaid work and for women workers without formal employment contracts. A law that also provides for maternal, paternal and parental leave, as well as the right to flexible work engagement due to early care obligations for children or other persons;
- Creation and implementation of new employment measures that are accessible to and take into consideration the specifics of all marginalized groups of women, especially Roma women, women with disabilities, women-victims of violence and single mothers;
- Urgent harmonization of policies and laws with the Istanbul Convention, as well as with Resolution 1325;
- Immediate adoption of amendments to the Criminal Code for harmonization with the Istanbul Convention and comprehensive protection of women from violence.

2.MARCH FOR VISIBILITY OF THE TRANSGENDER COMMUNITY

In March 2022, Ekvális marched together for International Transgender Day of Visibility. On a joint march organized by Transforma- (non-formal group led by transgender community members), Ekvális gave support to the ongoing struggles of the transgender community. The activists requested urgent adoption of the Law for Gender Recognition stating the urgency for such action and how the lack of such legislation affects the daily life of transgender people across the country.



3.SKOPJE PRIDE 2022

On Saturday, June 25, 2022, the third Skopje Pride took place under the slogan "Come Out for Love! Dignity. Equality. Justice." Skopje Pride is organized by the National Network against Homophobia and Transphobia. Ekvalis is a member of the Network and part of the Organizing Committee at Skopje Pride.

Unlike the previous editions of the Pride, the starting time was postponed to the late afternoon. The starting point, as before was in the Park "Woman Warrior", where the gathering of participants began at 5 pm, and at 7 pm after several short speeches, the protest march started in the streets of Skopje and ended with the entertaining cultural program at the ARM Stadium in the City Park.



Skopje Pride invited the community to Come Out for Love, because in times of crisis, war, and poverty, love is easily forgotten, and hatred occupies the minds and hearts of people far more easily. Because only with love can we resist the violence to which those who are different are subjected even when there is peace for all others. Because no one should be deprived of the right to love or be persecuted because their love is not recognized by norms and laws. Because love must win.



ADVOCACY AND CAMPAIGNING

1. CAMPAIGN TO REVITALIZE DEMOCRACY “DEMOCRACY HERE- DEMOCRACY NOW“ BY COUNCIL OF EUROPE

In 2022, the Council of Europe launched the campaign “Democracy Here- Democracy now“. Ekvális participated in the national implementation of this campaign and also later on in the drafting of the Call for Actions at the Youth Action Week in Strasbourg- France.

“Democracy here- Democracy now” is an international campaign launched by the Council of Europe’s Youth Department with the goal of connecting young people, youth organizations, institutions, and other stakeholders, and providing them with a space to discuss the state of democracy in Europe as well as an opportunity to discuss ways forward in revitalizing democracy! The campaign focuses on access to rights, digitalization and meaningful participation of youth as one of the decisive factors when talking about revitalizing democracy.

The Council of Europe recognizes the “considerable potential and therefore fundamental role in promoting Council of Europe’s values” that young people play. Democracy has been particularly challenged in recent years due to the rise of populism and demotatorships, fake news, shrinking space for civil society and, more recently, the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic. All of this contributes to a climate where young people fear retribution when exercising freedom of expression and, at the same time, “show a high degree of political interest but a low degree of engagement with essential democratic processes”. Concerns regarding the health of democracies in Europe have been consistently raised, especially in view of the successive and multiple crises that trouble the perspective of growing up with confidence about the future. The war in Ukraine aggravated the sentiment of crisis and the need to act to save democracy and peace.

The only response to the problems of democracy is more democracy: democracy is a process of democratisation. Learning about and for democracy, support and recognition given to structures and new forms of youth participation, including an enabling environment for youth civil society, remain key areas of action.

Democracy Here | Democracy Now is a Council of Europe project aiming for revitalising democracy and for strengthening mutual trust between young people and democratic institutions and processes. Initiated at the call of the Advisory Council on Youth, the campaign phase focused on raising awareness and mobilising young people to discuss and explore the topic of democracy, as well as their role in the processes to revitalise it. In this phase, 40 projects, both international and local, were implemented with the support of the European Youth Foundation. 28 National contact points further mobilised initiative and raised awareness in the member states. Ekvális implemented the project “Perspective of Gender and LGBTQ+ Youth Movements“ that focused on the role that gender and queer minorities play in sustaining inclusive democracies. As part of the project Ekvális undertook several actions to promote the campaign in general. The Democracy Here-Democracy Now campaign was promoted at the Training for Activists, a public action in Strumica for revitalizing democracy and the roundtable where activists, NGOs and government institutions discussed the risks of securing inclusive democracy in North Macedonia.

2. YOUTH ACTION WEEK- FLAGSHIP EVENT OF THE “DEMOCRACY HERE- DEMOCRACY NOW CAMPAIGN“

The Youth Action Week was the flagship event of the Democracy Here | Democracy Now campaign and of the anniversary of 50 years of the youth sector in the Council of Europe. Ekvális' program coordinator Angel Dimitrievski attended this event. The event was organized under the patronage of the Irish Presidency of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe and in partnership with the City of Strasbourg.



The Council of Europe Youth Action Week brought together activists, civil society, member States and partners of the youth sector to strengthen the youth campaign for revitalizing democracy and celebrate the 50th anniversary of the youth sector of the Council of Europe. The week resulted in proposals for action at local, national and international level in the framework of the Democracy Here | Democracy Now youth campaign, including recommendations addressed to stakeholders aiming to revitalize democracy and support the meaningful participation of young people in democratic processes and institutions. 3. SOCIAL MEDIA CAMPAIGN FOR PROMOTION OF INCLUSIVE DEMOCRACY WITH FOCUS ON GENDER AND QUEER MINORITIES



As a follow-up product from the training for activists “Youth Inputs in Sustaining Gender and LGBTIQ+ Movements”, the participants created a media campaign that placed media narratives based on the principles of inclusion, equality and respect for gender and sexual minorities. This campaign was a strategic response to the ongoing attacks by the anti-gender movements in North Macedonia.

All participants were included in launching a media campaign that created positive narratives, media discourses and stories that are based on dignity, equality and that dismantled the fake news spread by the anti-gender movements. With enabling the participants to directly interact with other youth and community members, the project positioned them as true democracy frontrunners and the project itself reached an even wider audience. The online campaign had 101,531 reaches across social media and 5727 unique engagements.

NETWORKING, PARTNERSHIP AND MOBILITY

1. Training course: „Media Sapiens: Training Course on Media Literacy for Youth Workers“

In March 2022 two Ekvális volunteers were a part of the training "Media Sapiens: Training Course on Media Literacy for Youth Workers" that took place in the Czech Republic. The training had the aim to increase the participants' knowledge about media literacy with a special focus on analysis and evaluation of media messages, distinguishing objective information from disinformation and the impact of media messages on public opinion. The purpose of the training was to also develop the skills of the participants for building creative campaigns with the correct use of information and production of video materials and to encourage the participants to actively use digital media to get involved in problems and issues that affect them socially.

This training was organized by our partners Mission: Reconnect.

2. Training course: "Unmasking Young Mental Health"

In April 2022, five of our volunteers attended the "Unmasking Young Mental Health" training in Sremski Karlovci, Serbia, which was being implemented by our partner organization, Hajde da. At the training there were participants from Serbia, Croatia, Slovenia, Italy and North Macedonia.

The content of this training aimed to prepare the participants for their future work with young people and/or peers, in terms of dealing with challenging situations. More specifically, to prepare youth workers to work and talk on topics about mental health among young people, how to handle acute mental health crises, learn how to offer help and where to direct the young people if needed.



After the training our volunteers held a workshop for young people in their hometown on the topic of "Personal challenges during Covid-19". The workshop was held with young people from Negotino and the surrounding area, and it was carried out in the premises of Muzej Na Grad Negotino (Museum of the city of Negotino).

3. Study visit: "Go Natural: Add quality to your life"

In July 2022 one volunteer from Ekvális attended the study visit "Go Natural: Add quality to your life" organized by our partners JOETZ vzw and PVN Albania. The participants from 10 partner organizations had the opportunity to visit several organizations and witness their work in Albania in the cities of Valbona, Shirok, Shkodra and Mrizi and Zanave.

During the study visit, the participants made leaflets and a short film in order to share their experience and knowledge and be an inspiration to other people in the local community.



4. Contact making seminar: "Idea Lab"

In June 2022, three volunteers from Ekvális attended the contact making seminar "Idea Lab", focusing on networking and creating new project ideas in the framework of the Erasmus + Program, in Prerov, Czech Republic.

The event was attended by participants from 11 countries (Armenia, Georgia, Lithuania, Latvia, Turkey, Romania, Serbia, the Czech Republic, France, and North Macedonia). The seminar lasted 7 days during which the participants had the opportunity to embark on an exciting journey of networking, idea generation, tool and experience sharing, project management, and exploration of opportunities provided by Erasmus+ Program at the contact making seminar implemented by our partners "Mission: Reconnect".



By presenting their organizations and addressing the challenges they face while working with young people and as young people themselves, the participants gained new perspectives on the needs/ problems they want to address in their home countries.

While learning about the Erasmus+ Program, the participants got a unique opportunity to come up with and develop their project ideas. The goal of the event was to encourage youth workers to discuss ideas, share experiences and helpful tips, form new potential local and international partnerships, inspire each other, and create new project ideas together in the Erasmus+ framework.

After the event, there were online follow-up meetings as a way of continuing the communication between the participants and the organizations.

5.Contact making seminar: "The roaring 2020's. Dancing for inclusion"

In October 2022 three representatives from Ekvalis attended the contact making seminar "The roaring 2020's. Dancing for inclusion" in Barcelona, Spain organized by our partners La Vibria Intercultural.

During the seminar participants from 14 countries and partner organizations had the opportunity to expand their partnerships, knowledge and practice in dance as a tool for informal learning and social inclusion. As part of the seminar, the participants had the opportunity to develop their project ideas in a local context through dance and body expression as a tool for informal education.



6.Training course: "Theatre for Youth"

In November 2022, in Guggisberg, Switzerland two Ekvalis volunteers attended the training course "Theater for Youth" on the use of forum theater and theater of the oppressed as a methodology when working with youth. The training course had almost 20 participants from 9 different countries (Kosovo, North Macedonia, Serbia, Israel, Germany, Switzerland, Bulgaria, Palestine and the United Kingdom). During this training the participants had the opportunity to learn how to deal with oppression of any kind in society.

The project was organized in order to help the participants express through theater empowering solutions for everyday life while working with youth.

Through the different games and activities, the participants were included in real life situations expressing them through the acting. The forum theater as a technique was brought close to the participants in order to explain to them how dealing with oppression everyday can be resolved and how to help the others see its existence. The training course was organized by our partners Foundation Urgestein in Switzerland.



7. Volunteer service in Belgium through the European Solidarity Corps program

Two of our volunteers participated in a team volunteering program, in Leuven, Belgium, in one of our partner organization De Wissel vzw, through the European Solidarity Corps. Together with a team of 10 other international volunteers from Spain, Morocco, France, Slovenia, Kosovo, Hungary and Belgium, worked at a camp for children, and also helped with the daily maintenance of the youth center, Centrum Molenmoes. In addition to work duties, socializing and new experiences were an inevitable part of the three-week volunteer program.
